We are the only federally funded coalition in Elgin. There is an estimated 113,000 people in Elgin with nearly half being Hispanic, 6% African American, 6% Asian and the rest White. About 27% are under the age of 18. Our primary goals address underage drinking as well as marijuana and opioid use among our youth and increase community collaboration among the over 250 local social service agencies and community-based organizations. Activities and accomplishments to date are alternative youth nights to hundreds of middle students, social hosting information for landlords, youth Impact planning/participation, local health assessment focus group, county Opioid Task Force, summer student kick-off celebration, coalition board retreat, community resource brochure, bottle neck hangers event and published Parent/Teen Q&A. The greatest challenge has been in securing solid buy-in from our local school district. Our Coalition is unique in that it is demonstratively diverse in gender (15 males, 12 females) and ethnicity (15 Whites, 8 Hispanics and 4 Blacks) as being around in one form or another since 1992.

We currently collaborate with our fiscal agent's Youth Advisory Committee on events, give presentations to them, help chaperone their events and utilize them for focus groups and informal information gathering. Through our youth-centered events we ask, as part of their evaluation, if they are interested in participating further in the planning and executing the goals of the coalition.

We managed to secure 4 youth. Two high school students and two middle school students. The two high school students attend public schools and the two middle school students attend private schools. Additionally, after much effort, we were able to secure a high-level individual from the City Manager's office as a Government sector representative.

We had struggle for a long time to secure Youth Sector representatives and nearly at the same time we secured four. A similar struggle existed with City representative and with a strategy in place and implemented we were able to secure one from the City Manager's Office.

The Education Sector continues to be a struggle. Our district is larger than our grant's geographical boundaries and therefore, at the District level, their support is less than enthusiastic given they seek to support District-wide collaborations and not just city-wide. Additionally, the District seems more interested in intervention approach rather than preventative. Lastly, the District continues with a passive approach in participating in our state-wide bi-annual Youth Survey. One to one meetings with the Superintendent have been secured but have not resulted in a more positive and productive collaboration. Lastly, the pandemic has crippled efforts to meet and seek new members one-to-one.
