

## **MINUTES**

**10:35:** The president, Jack Wheatley, called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were done by all attendees. **11:30:** Gil Feliciano shared a coordinator report, which covered the CADCA conference. Gil's takes. Relationship between marijuana, tobacco, alcohol, and how they are related. Gil also proposed the question on sustainability. "Would Elgin be okay without the coalition?"

**11:40:** John shared data about students who are missing days and failing classes. "The numbers are not getting better." Tina asked John, and he agreed, for a warm handoff with principals so that we can help or give things needed to school clubs that are part of anti-drugs, etc. 1,186 students have missed 34 days on average and failing 9 classes per year.

11:50: Jack introduced the new Executive Director of Renz. Deb Howe.
